

Frank Wraight Obituary (12-11-04)

Frank Donald Wraight of Loveland, CO died December 11, 2004 while enjoying a trip to Branson, MO. He died of a brain aneurism. Frank was a long-time member of the Indiana Section ASCE and was the first President of the Metropolitan Indianapolis Branch.

He was born August 20, 1918 in Brodhead, Wisconsin, graduated from Brodhead High School and the University of Wisconsin.

He served in the military for five years during World War II, ending as a major in Japan in 1945. He was commander of the 671st Topographic Engineering Company in New Guinea and the Philippines. He later served in the Army Reserves and retired as a lieutenant colonel.

After college, Frank worked for the Indiana Board of Health, as head of the Sewage Treatment Section, until 1960. He then formed and co-owned W & W Equipment Company until his retirement in 1986.

Frank and his wife Margaret were residents of Speedway, IN before relocating to Loveland, CO in May 2004. He was active on the Indiana Water Pollution Control Board and in the Rotary Club. He participated in holiday parades with the Shriners and volunteered at Methodist Hospital. He worked with the safety patrol in May at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. He was an avid golfer, traveler and history buff.

Frank and his wife were members of the Speedway Christian Church. He is survived by his wife Margaret, three children, nine grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.
